COMMENTS: All Incoming transfers in Section C are from Mesa County Animal Services Incoming transfers from Maddie's Fund partner orgs are: 3 from Montrose County Animal Services and 191 from Mesa County Animal Services. Incoming transfers from outside coalition (line D) are from Pet Samaritin out of Utah. They take them out of shelters with a high kill rate, one that euthanizes 90% of the cats that come in. That's why we help them.
